Major Lower Range Work

If you haven't been by the club lately then you haven't had a chance to see the work we have had done to the lower outdoor range.

A contractor was hired to move dirt to increase the height of the 200 yard berm and move the handgun range so it is parallel to the rifle range and its firing points are in line with the shooting benches under the shelter. Some of the brush has been

cleaned up along with the re-opening of the ditch that was at the bottom of the hill. This ditch drained the east side of the propertv to the river through a tube under the drive. You will also notice short intermediate berms which have been placed just beyond the 50 yard target line and the 100 vard target These coupled line with new target holders will catch any shots from possibly

glancing off the ground. It is very important that we all use the new holders, paper targets and only shoot down your firing point lane.

This spring as soon as the weather allows, the contractor still has to do a little work and we will then have the task of smoothing the ground, planting grass seed and re-installing the target holder sockets. The ranges will remain closed until the work is complete.

Membership Limit / By-Law Change

At our November 2013 Membership meeting it was motioned and passed that the limit cap of 225 members be removed from our by-laws. Currently we are at our maximum of 225 members and no new members can be accepted until after the February

meeting which is the last chance for renewal of club memberships. Then the new applicants would fill the vacated spaces. This has set off a series of fire storms from how we handle a increase in members by the club officials to background checks to

the current misuse of club facilities by unknown individuals.. The motion was again read at the December meeting and will be voted on at the February meeting according to the proper procedure to amend the by-laws.

From the Prez - Membership Issues

bers, people that would like to close the club ranges, and people that would like open the club to anyone. It is only after much thought that I have come to the decision that until we get our new member application system

in place it is NOT worth the risk of losing our right to discharge firearms outside our building just to possibly gain a very few new members for a short time. I am quite sure there will be membership slots available after the Feb. meeting, if NOT we will have a new membership process in place by 1 July 2014 and any deserving person will be able to have full membership.


