No More Safety Inspection for Handguns

Pistol Purchase laws changed on January 7th, 2009 for Michigan residents.

The so called Registration (Safety Inspection) has been eliminated. This means no more trips to the Cop Shop for them to inspect your firearm through the glass.

This does not mean they don't have your number!

Both the Pistol Purchase Permit and the Pistol Sales Record have changed to a 4 part form. The Seller keeps a copy, the Buyer keeps a copy and then Buyer sends 2 copies to their local Police agency, who then forwards a copy to the

MSP. One other requirement is for the Buyer to carry their copy of the form with them for the first 30 days after the sale when transporting/ carrying the handgun.

On the Range:

Just a few things on Range Safety and Etiquette:

NRA Safety Rules

1. Always keep the gun pointed in a safe direction (**down range not up**)
2. Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot
3. Always keep the gun unloaded until ready to use

Play nice with the other kids;

Just because someone is using the range does not mean that they have ear protection in. Some of you may be surprised to find out that Archers do not wear ear protection. Even the LOUDEST bow is well below the sound level that requires ear protection. Archers like to concentrate when they shoot, any LOUD noise will throw them off their game.

If someone is shooting a bow on the range, it is not OK to start shooting your pistol just because there is a target down range. You might want to ask before you shoot, so you don't get something chewed off!
