In addition to those items we will be starting work on repairing the facility's roofs. This is long over due and at a critical point where the building will sustain additional damage if the work is not started very soon.

Spring Clean up

Mark your calendars for April 24th, 8:00 A.M.. You need to remember this date and keep it open for the annual cleanup of the club and grounds. Here is a list of chores which we want to accomplish, and some items that you may want to bring:

- ✓ Clean and restore Trap ranges (between walks) with topsoil and grass seed- shovels and rakes
- ✓ Cut weeds, trees and branches- weedwackers, chain saws, pruning shears (bring a trailer if you want the wood)
- ✓ Take down sporting traps for refurbishing-tools, wrenches, pliers, etc.
- ✓ Pick up lower ranges
- ✓ New burn barrel and clean out the grill-new barrel
- ✓ Haul junk to the dump- truck and trailer
- ✓ Club room, if the outdoor work is too strenuous for you-cleaning products, vacuum

Clearly, there is a lot to do in a day so bring your tools if you have them, lots of energy and plan to get the club in shape for the season. There will be coffee and rolls with plenty of sugar and caffeine to get you motivated and off to a good start. It's a full days work if you can lend a hand, if you can only help out for a few hours, we'll gladly take it and it will be appreciated.

Roof Repair

We have a plan to repair the roof, it includes some help from members, some materials, scaffolding and some dry weather. I will be getting a notice out via email when things are about to come together and a date is picked, so be ready to come to the aid of your club.

Rifle Range

There will be further discussion on these items at the April meeting. Since time is of the essence we need to get moving on these suggestions. As you may have noticed I have designated a date on the May Calendar for the first rifle event, the schedule will continue with the last Sunday of the month as the day for the Rifle Program.

Action Pistol

If your wondering about the different type of activities under the Action Pistol listing on the calendar, well here is what it's about. In addition to the usual Defensive Scenarios which are shot with your typical centerfire carry guns, we started to shoot the club's self healing reactive targets with .22 pistols. Generally that evening starts with timed shooting of the bowling pin targets, then the group sets up the falling plates and popper set up for two person eliminations. You know it amazing how even some of the best shooters falter a little when they go against the clock. Typically on Reactive Night we have about dozen shooters, but there is still room for more. So, come on out, get back to basics and have some fun, we have a nice group and the ladies are really giving the boys a run for our money. As the weather gets better we'll be heading over the hill to do some things outside with pins, balloons and the like.
